

Mint

“Marvelous Mix”

All mint, including “Marvelous Mix”, spreads easily both by roots and seeds. Please choose your planting location thoughtfully or use it as a container grown plant! This variety makes an excellent jelly to serve with roasted meats as well as syrup for cocktails (Easy Mint Julep). Perennial herb. Deer and rabbit resistant.

Detailed Growing Guide:

Location: Choose a location that receives full sun or partial shade

Soil: Use well-draining soil, preferably amended with compost.

Watering: Water deeply and regularly, keeping the soil evenly moist but not waterlogged.

Fertilizing: Mint doesn't require heavy fertilization, but a light application of compost in the spring can be beneficial.

Spacing: Space plants 12 inches apart when transplanting outdoors.

Harvesting: Harvest leaves regularly by pinching off stems above a node to encourage bushier growth.

Controlling Spreading: Mint is aggressive and can spread via rhizomes, so it's best to grow it in containers or in a contained location in the ground.

Pest and Disease Control: Mint is generally resistant to pests and diseases, but keep an eye out for spider mites, especially in dry conditions, and apply appropriate treatments if needed.
